	½ c walnuts (optional)	5. Mix brown sugar & butter; pour over biscuits	
	1c brown sugar	6. Bake 28-32 minutes or until golden and center is not doughy	
	¾ c melted butter	7. Cool in pan 10 minutes then turn upside down on serving plate.
